Will-O-Wisp Metro Water District is please to announce that the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers has approved their 404 Permit (Raw Water Diversion Project). This Permit allows Will-O-Wisp to utilize it's second source of water by diverting water from Elk Creek to the District. This permit is the last step in the District's Applications as required by the Park County 1041 and the U.S. Army's Corps of Engineers Applications.

On Monday, May 3, 2010 Timothy Carey, Program Manager Denver Regulatory Office, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Omaha District, and Rick Angelica, Will-O-Wisp Metro Water District Board President signed the District's 404 Permit.

Rick Angelica stated that this is a "Big step forward in the District's ability to utilize their Court Decreed second source of water, to insure the Districts Water Supply". "We would like to Thank the WOW Board Members, District Employees, Park County Commissioners, District Engineers, Legal Team, Consultants and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for their hard work and dedication in helping us get through this long process".
